EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

- New stand-alone Young 5's classrooms

Pillars of the Project

Q How would we elevate education in this project?

A The project would elevate education by addressing space constraints, adding new facilities like the Early Childhood Center, renovating existing spaces such as science labs and CTE areas, creating flexible learning environments, upgrading technology, and expanding opportunities for hands-on learning through improvements to specialized spaces like robotics and STEM facilities.

Q Why are we considering an Early Childhood Center?

A The Early Childhood Center would alleviate elementary overcrowding by moving the Young 5's and Kindergarten students to meet the unique educational needs of our youngest students. Based on enrollment, there is also a potential to add 4-year-old classrooms and support the district's growing student population.

Q How would this project improve safety for our students?

A This project would improve student safety by adding secure entries at all schools creating an entry where visitors must enter the main office before entering the building.

SCHOOL BOND PROPOSAL LANGUAGE

Shall Houghton-Portage Township School District, Houghton County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Twenty-Three Million Dollars (\$23,000,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of:

erecting a new early childhood center; erecting an addition to the elementary school; remodeling, furnishing and refurbishing and equipping and re-equipping school buildings; acquiring, installing, equipping and re-equipping school buildings for instructional technology; and acquiring, preparing, developing, improving and equipping playgrounds and sites?



Bond Proceeds **CANNOT**

be used, by law, for:

- General operating expenses and maintenance
- Classroom textbooks or educational materials
- Administration, professional or support staff benefits, salaries and/or wages

Why Now?

Houghton-Portage Township Schools is asking voters to consider a bond due to significant student growth. Since 2013, we've seen an 8% increase (101 more students), which has created space issues, especially in our elementary school.

The proposed bond would fund several improvements:

1. A new Early Childhood Center for Young 5's pre- and Kindergarten students
2. This would reduce overcrowding in the elementary school and improve early education

These changes would benefit the district in two main ways:

1. Enhance the learning experience for students
2. Support community growth by maintaining high-quality schools that attract families and foster local talent

Additionally, the bond would support older students through:

1. A new recreation area for middle schoolers
2. Renovated science labs
3. Improved industrial and technical education spaces in the high school
